



Sexual Misconduct on Campus: Find Support & Know Your Rights

At Emmanuel College, we have dedicated resources and support services for those who have been the survivor of sexual misconduct/assault.

IMMEDIATE SAFETY IS THE TOP PRIORITY

- Get to a safe space
- Contact Campus Safety, they are available 24/7
- Seek medical help if needed

NEXT STEPS ARE IMPORTANT TO ENSURING WELL-BEING

Survivors have the right to:

- Formally report to the Title IX Coordinator or Title IX Deputies
- Get on-campus support if reporting to the Boston Police Department
- Contact confidential staff members on campus
- Be well-informed of the College's reporting, investigation and judicial process
- Change academic or work situations

- Obtain or enforce no contact or restraining orders
- Receive information about counseling and support services

Survivors should be mindful of self-care:

- Seek support; there are a variety of resources both on- and off-campus
- Take care of physical health by getting enough sleep and eating well
- Consider professional counseling and seek resources for stress reduction
- Refrain from the use of drugs and alcohol
- Remember that self-care is a process, unique to each person
- Know that sexual assault is NEVER your fault, under any circumstances

- Avoid blame or accusatory questions/comments
